
Event Terms & Conditions

World Conference on Floating Solutions 2026 (WCFS 2026)

Organiser: Technology Centre for Offshore and Marine, Singapore Ltd (TCOMS)

1. Introduction

These Event Terms & Conditions (“Event Terms”) govern your attendance and/or participation at the World Conference on Floating Solutions 2026 (“Event”). By registering for, attending or participating in the Event, you accept and agree to comply with these Event Terms, the Payment Policy, and the Privacy Policy, which shall form a binding contract between Technology Centre for Offshore and Marine, Singapore Ltd (TCOMS) and the registered attendee and/or participant (“you” or “your”). If you are registering on behalf of another party or person, you shall ensure that the attendee and/or participant accepts and agrees to comply with these Event Terms, the Payment Policy, and the Privacy Policy.

2. Registration and Admission

2.1. Admission

Your registration entitles you to admittance to and participation in the Event. All Event registrations and tickets are **non-transferable** to any other person that is not the named attendee and/or participant. For the avoidance of doubt, all other costs and expenses associated with your attendance of and participation in the Event shall be borne solely by you.

2.2. Code of Conduct

You shall behave respectfully and comply with all instructions, rules and requirements of TCOMS and the venue provider in connection with the Event (collectively, “**Rules**”). Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, you agree to the following Rules:

On the Event Grounds

1. You must wear and display your WCFS 2026 Event pass at all times on site.
2. Your entry may be subjected to security checks in accordance with TCOMS and venue requirements.
3. Emergency exits, walkways, and safety equipment must be kept clear at all times.
4. You must comply with all instructions from Event staff, venue personnel, and emergency authorities relating to safety and event operations.

Venue Rules

1. Smoking is not permitted indoors in the Event venue. Smoking is only allowed in designated smoking areas (if available).
2. Outside food and beverages are not allowed unless approved by TCOMS or venue provider.

Prohibited Behaviour

You shall not engage in any of the following behaviour at the Event venue:

1. Disruptive, unsafe, abusive, or offensive behaviour
2. Actions that endanger people or property
3. Unauthorized solicitation, promotions, or distribution of materials
4. Unauthorized photography, videography, or recordings in restricted areas
5. Bringing prohibited, illegal, or dangerous items into the venue

Dress Code

You are expected to dress appropriately for a professional indoor conference. Attire that is unsafe, offensive, or inappropriate may result in refusal of entry or removal from the Event.

You agree that TCOMS and the venue provider shall have the full discretion and authority to request your removal from the Event if TCOMS and/or the venue provider determines that you have failed to comply with any of the Rules.

2.3. Media

You agree that TCOMS may take photographs, audio or video recordings of the Event and use, reproduce, display and/or distribute the same in any format in relation to the Event and future editions thereof, including but not limited to displaying the same on the Event website, social media platforms and in Event promotional materials.

3. Event Changes

You accept that TCOMS shall have the full discretion and authority to cancel, re-arrange (including change in the Event location) or postpone the Event, or to amend the Event duration or programme. TCOMS shall notify you as soon as it is practicable if there are any cancellation, re-arrangement or postponement of the Event or any change in the Event duration.

Your rights on registration cancellations and refunds in the event of Event cancellations (including as a result of a Force Majeure Event (as defined below)) or postponements are set out in the Payment Policy.

4. Intellectual Property

All intellectual property rights, title and interests to the Event materials, information and/or content distributed, released or published (collectively, “**Materials**”) by or on behalf of TCOMS in connection with the Event shall be owned by TCOMS. Nothing herein shall be deemed to vest in you or grant to you any rights in or to these Materials, save that you are permitted to use the Materials for your personal reference only.

You shall not, and shall not permit any other party to, use the name or logo of TCOMS or any Event partner/sponsor/exhibitor, or otherwise issue any press release or publicity or public disclosure relating to the Event, save with the prior written consent of TCOMS.

5. Personal Data and Privacy

TCOMS is committed to protecting your personal data. We take your privacy seriously and will collect, process, and use your personal data in accordance with the Privacy Policy.

6. Force Majeure

- **Force Majeure.** A “**Force Majeure Event**” refers to any event beyond the reasonable control of TCOMS, including but not limited to: natural disasters, fire, flood, severe weather, epidemics or pandemics, government restrictions or directives, venue closures, national emergencies, acts of terrorism, civil unrest, labour disruptions, or major power or network failures that prevent the safe or lawful delivery of the Event.

 - **Impact on the Event.** If a Force Majeure Event materially affects the Event, TCOMS may, at its discretion and by providing notice to you, do one or more of the following:
 - postpone the Event to a later date and/or change the duration of the Event,
 - change the location of the Event,
 - convert the Event to a virtual or hybrid format, or
 - cancel the Event if postponement or modification is not feasible.

 - **No Waiver of Prior Obligations.** A Force Majeure Event does not excuse any payment obligations due that became due before the event occurred, nor does it relieve either party of obligations unaffected by the Force Majeure Event.
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7. Insurance, Warranty and Liability

7.1. Personal Insurance

You are responsible for obtaining your own insurance as may be required and/or appropriate for your participation in the Event.

7.2. Loss, Damage or Theft of Property

You are responsible for securing your own belongings and property at the Event. TCOMS is not responsible for any loss, damage or theft of your belongings or property or any personal injury at the Event venue, save where liability cannot be excluded by applicable law.

7.3. No Warranty

TCOMS does not make any representations, conditions or warranties, either express or implied, with respect to the Event. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, TCOMS expressly disclaims any implied warranty, condition or representation that the Event shall correspond with a particular description, is of a merchantable satisfactory quality or is fit for a particular purpose.

7.4. Limitation of Liability

Save for death or personal injury caused by negligence or save where otherwise provided under this Event Terms or the Payment Policy, TCOMS, its service providers (including the Event venue operator) and TCOMS's affiliates shall not be liable for any loss or damages arising from or in connection with your participation in the Event, including but not limited to, cancellation, rearrangement, postponement, variation, shortening or extension, or change of format or programme of the Event, any loss, damage or theft of your belongings or property, or the failure of any exhibitor or speaker to attend the Event. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, TCOMS, its service providers (including the Event venue operator) and TCOMS's affiliates shall not be liable for any direct, special, incidental, consequential damages, loss of profits or pure economic loss arising out of or in connection with the Event. In any event, the total cumulative liability of TCOMS, its service providers (including the Event venue operator) and its respective affiliates for any loss, damage or expenses arising from or in connection with this Event shall not exceed the amount paid by you to TCOMS for the Event registration (excluding any prevailing Goods and Services Tax or other applicable taxes).

8. Governing Law and Dispute Resolution

- **Governing Law.** These terms and conditions shall be governed by the laws of Singapore.
 - **Dispute Resolution.** Any disputes shall be resolved through discussions in good faith with TCOMS. If the disputes cannot be resolved within thirty (30) business days, either party may refer such dispute to mediation at the Mediation Centre of the Consumer Association of Singapore. If the dispute cannot be resolved by mediation within three (3) months, either party may refer the dispute to resolution by the Small Claims Tribunals of the State Courts of Singapore.
